You have choices about how to get your Medicare benefits

One choice is to get your Medicare benefits through Original Medicare (fee-for-service Medicare). Original Medicare is run directly by the Federal government.

Another choice is to get your Medicare benefits by joining a Medicare health plan (such as **PacificSource Medicare Essentials Rx 21 (HMO)**).

Who can join?

To join **PacificSource Medicare Essentials Rx 21 (HMO)**, you must be entitled to Medicare Part A, be enrolled in Medicare Part B, and live in our service area. Our service area includes the following counties in Idaho: Bannock, Bingham, Bonneville, Jefferson, and Madison.

Which doctors, hospitals, and pharmacies can I use?

PacificSource Medicare Essentials Rx 21 (HMO) has a network of doctors, hospitals, pharmacies, and other providers. If you use the providers that are not in our network, the plan may not pay for these services.

You must generally use network pharmacies to fill your prescriptions for covered Part D drugs. Some of our network pharmacies have preferred cost-sharing. You may pay less if you use these pharmacies.

What do we cover?

Like all Medicare health plans, we cover everything that Original Medicare covers – and more.

- **Our plan members get all of the benefits covered by Original Medicare. For some of these benefits, you may pay more in our plan than you would in Original Medicare.** For others, you may pay less.
- **Our plan members also get more than what is covered by Original Medicare.** Some of the extra benefits are outlined in this booklet.

We cover Part D drugs. In addition, we cover Part B drugs such as chemotherapy and some drugs administered by your provider.

How will I determine my drug costs?

Our plan groups each medication into one of six "tiers." You will need to use your formulary to locate what tier your drug is on to determine how much it will cost you. The amount you pay depends on the drug's tier and what stage of the benefit you have reached. Later in this document we discuss the benefit stages that occur: Initial Coverage, Coverage Gap, and Catastrophic Coverage.

Summary of Benefits

January 1, 2016 – December 31, 2016

Monthly Premium, Deductible, and Limits on How Much You Pay for Covered Services

How much is the monthly premium?	\$91 per month. In addition, you must keep paying your Medicare Part B premium.
How much is the deductible?	This plan does not have a deductible.
Is there any limit on how much I will pay for my covered services?	<p>Yes. Like all Medicare health plans, our plan protects you by having yearly limits on your out-of-pocket costs for medical and hospital care.</p> <p>Your yearly limit(s) in this plan: \$3,400 for services you receive from in-network providers.</p> <p>If you reach the limit on out-of-pocket costs, you keep getting covered hospital and medical services and we will pay the full cost for the rest of the year.</p> <p>Please note that you will still need to pay your monthly premiums and cost-sharing for your Part D prescription drugs.</p>
Is there a limit on how much the plan will pay?	Our plan has a coverage limit every year for certain in-network benefits. Contact us for the services that apply.

Covered Medical and Hospital Benefits

Chiropractic Care	Manipulation of the spine to correct a subluxation (when 1 or more of the bones of your spine move out of position): \$20 co-pay
Dental Services	Limited dental services (this does not include services in connection with care, treatment, filling, removal, or replacement of teeth): \$35 co-pay

Foot Care (podiatry services)	If you are immediately admitted to the hospital, you do not have to pay your share of the cost for emergency care. See the "Inpatient Hospital Care" section of this booklet for other costs.
Hearing Services	Foot exams and treatment if you have diabetes-related nerve damage and/or meet certain conditions: \$35 co-pay Exam to diagnose and treat hearing and balance issues: \$35 co-pay Routine hearing exam (for up to 1 every year): \$35 co-pay
Home Health Care ¹	20% of the cost
Mental Health Care ¹	Inpatient visit: Our plan covers up to 190 days in a lifetime for inpatient mental health care in a psychiatric hospital. The inpatient hospital care limit does not apply to inpatient mental services provided in a general hospital. Our plan covers 90 days for an inpatient hospital stay. Our plan also covers 60 "lifetime reserve days." These are "extra" days that we cover. If your hospital stay is longer than 90 days, you can use these extra days. But once you have used up these extra 60 days, your inpatient hospital coverage will be limited to 90 days. \$250 co-pay per day for days 1 through 7 You pay nothing per day for days 8 through 90 Outpatient group therapy visit: \$40 co-pay Outpatient individual therapy visit: \$40 co-pay
Outpatient Rehabilitation ¹	Cardiac (heart) rehab services (for a maximum of 2 one-hour sessions per day for up to 36 sessions up to 36 weeks): \$35 co-pay Occupational therapy visit: \$35 co-pay Physical therapy and speech and language therapy visit: \$35 co-pay

Vision Services	Exam to diagnose and treat diseases and conditions of the eye (including yearly glaucoma screening): \$0-35 co-pay, depending on the service Routine eye exam (for up to 1 every two years): \$35 co-pay Contact lenses: \$0 co-pay Eyeglasses (frames and lenses): \$0 co-pay Eyeglass frames: \$0 co-pay Eyeglass lenses: \$0 co-pay Eyeglasses or contact lenses after cataract surgery: You pay nothing Our plan pays up to \$100 every two years for eyewear.

Preventive Care

You pay nothing

Our plan covers many preventive services, including:

- Abdominal aortic aneurysm screening
- Alcohol misuse counseling
- Bone mass measurement
- Breast cancer screening (mammogram)
- Cardiovascular disease (behavioral therapy)
- Cardiovascular screenings
- Cervical and vaginal cancer screening
- Colorectal cancer screenings (Colonoscopy, Fecal occult blood test, Flexible sigmoidoscopy)
- Depression screening
- Diabetes screenings
- HIV screening
- Medical nutrition therapy services
- Obesity screening and counseling
- Prostate cancer screenings (PSA)
- Sexually transmitted infections screening and counseling
- Tobacco use cessation counseling (counseling for people with no sign of tobacco-related disease)

- Vaccines, including Flu shots, Hepatitis B shots, Pneumococcal shots
- "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit (one-time)
- Yearly "Wellness" visit

Any additional preventive services approved by Medicare during the contract year will be covered.

Hospice

You pay nothing for hospice care from a Medicare-certified hospice. You may have to pay part of the costs for drugs and respite care. Hospice is covered outside of our plan. Please contact us for more details.

Inpatient Care

	Our plan covers an unlimited number of days for an inpatient hospital stay.

Prescription Drug Benefits

How much do I pay? For Part B drugs such as chemotherapy drugs¹: 20% of the cost
Other Part B drugs¹: 20% of the cost

Initial Coverage

You pay the following until your total yearly drug costs reach \$3,310. Total yearly drug costs are the total drug costs paid by both you and our Part D plan.

You may get your drugs at network retail pharmacies and mail order pharmacies.

If you reside in a long-term care facility, you pay the same as at a retail pharmacy.

You may get drugs from an out-of-network pharmacy, but may pay more than you pay at an in-network pharmacy.

Coverage Gap

Most Medicare drug plans have a coverage gap (also called the "donut hole"). This means that there's a temporary change in what you will pay for your drugs. The coverage gap begins after the total yearly drug cost (including what our plan has paid and what you have paid) reaches \$3,310.

After you enter the coverage gap, you pay 45% of the plan's cost for covered brand name drugs and 58% of the plan's cost for covered generic drugs until your costs total \$4,850, which is the end of the coverage gap. Not everyone will enter the coverage gap.

Under this plan, you may pay even less for the brand and generic drugs on the formulary. Your cost varies by tier. You will need to use your formulary to locate your drug's tier. See the chart that follows to find out how much it will cost you.

Catastrophic Coverage

After your yearly out-of-pocket drug costs (including drugs purchased through your retail pharmacy and through mail order) reach \$4,850, you pay the greater of:

- 5% of the cost, or
- \$2.95 co-pay for generic (including brand drugs treated as generic) and a \$7.40 co-payment for all other drugs.

Optional Benefits (you must pay an extra premium each month for these benefits)

Additional \$24 per month. You must keep paying your Medicare Part B premium and your \$91 monthly plan premium.

**How much is the

**Is there any limit
on how much the
plan will pay?**

No. There is no limit to how much our plan will pay for benefits in this package.

PacificSource Community Health Plans is an HMO/PPO Plan with a Medicare contract. Enrollment in PacificSource Medicare depends on contract renewal. Limitations, co-payments, and restrictions may apply. Benefits, premium and co-payments/co-insurance may change on January 1 of each year. The formulary, pharmacy network, and provider network may change at any time. You will receive notice when necessary.
